COACHING / PLAYING TIPS

RULES

FAULTS

All Croquet players, both social and pennant, must be aware of the Rules involving faults.

FAULTS ONLY OCCUR DURING THE STRIKING PERIOD

In simplified terms. the striking period is the time after you have taken up your stance and about to play your shot.

In relation to faults, I have tried to describe the croquet rules as they relate to faults in a simplified manner. I will be explaining faults in the next coaching clinic.

FAULTS include:-

1. Touches the mallet head with a hand
2. Strikes a ball by kicking, hitting, dropping or throwing the mallet
3. Strikes a ball with any part of the mallet other than the face end
4. Strikes a ball with the mallet more than once or allows the ball to retouch the mallet.
(Double tap)
5. Maintains contact between the mallet and the ball (PUSH)
6. Causes a ball while in contact with the mallet to touch a hoop or peg or unless the balls were in contact before the stroke another ball other than away from it.
(Touching Balls)
7. Strikes a ball when it lies in contact with the hoop or peg other than away from it.
8. Touches any ball other than the ball the player intended to strike with the mallet or touches any ball with the players body
9. Moves or shakes a stationary ball by hitting a hoop or peg with the mallet or the players body.
10. Causes damage to the court.

ACTION AFTER A FAULT.

1. If play is not forestalled (stopped) and play continues then play continues and there is no remedy.
2. Otherwise the non offending side decides whether

The balls are left where they stopped or are replaced.

3. If the balls are left where they stopped only a point for the non offending side is counted if the hoop is run.
4. If balls replaced there are no points scored.
5. The offending player loses that shot, the play continues with the next player in sequence.
